



Scholarship Application

For full-time students

The College Park Community Association supports the education of its members by annually accepting applications for the College Park Community Association Scholarship Fund. Each year (at the discretion of the Executive) the Association will hold an event to raise funds for the Scholarship fund. The amount given may range between \$350 and \$700, depending on the funds raised at the annual fundraising event.

Eligibility and instructions:

- 1. Applicant must be a grade 12 student enrolling in studies in a post-secondary institution (including college, technical institute, or university).**
- 2. Applicant's family must be members of the College Park Community Association with dues paid up-to-date as of May of application year.**
- 3. Applicant must reside in College Park.**
- 4. Applicant must be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident.**

- 5. Applications must be received by the College Park Community Association by May 21st in current year of application submission to be considered. No late applications will be accepted. Funds will be awarded upon verification of registration and attendance in the course/program.**
- 6. A reference letter from a high school teacher, counsellor or principal is required.**
- 7. Applications must be completed in full and the transcripts and reference letter must be included to be considered. Note: unofficial transcripts and scanned versions of official transcripts are accepted**
- 8. Please e-mail all applications to cpcacommunity@gmail.com with the subject Application for Scholarship. Reach out to board members if you do not hear from them within 48hrs.**
- 9. Awards must be claimed by November 1st in current year of application submission.**

Application Evaluation:

Applications are evaluated for their overall quality and by the annually advertised criteria that will be the same as the following:

- 1. Educational achievements (50%)**
- 2. Motivation for scholarship application, educational goals, career goals, participation in extra-curricular activities in the last 2 years, reference letter from school teacher or principal, overall presentation of application (50%)**

Highest score is the recipient of the scholarship. If the score is close, the screening committee reserves the right to appoint two winners who will each be awarded a scholarship of no less than \$350 each. The scholarship recipient must be decided by May 31st of that year. If scores are all below 50%, the scholarship will not be awarded.

Screening Committee:

A screening committee will be involved in the process of choosing the applicant that best meets the criteria. Executive members from the College Park Community Association will not be part of the screening process.
